Bruce Carlson is from Wilkinsburg, Pennsylvania, where he attended public schools. He graduated from the University of Pittsburgh School of Law in 1989, where he was the Executive Editor of the Journal of Law and Commerce. He also obtained his undergraduate degree from the University of Pittsburgh, graduating summa cum laude in political philosophy. After law school, he was employed for approximately four years at Eckert Seamans Cherin & Mellott, in Pittsburgh.
